

Music by Bill Evans

Bill played "Funkallero" as a piano solo on one of his first jobs in New York. "I was getting into kind of a swing thing and this line just naturally came out of that feeling. It's a natural vehicle for blowing."

In measures 10–11, we see an example of Bill's creative approach to a ii–V chord progression: the ii–V harmony (Blm7-El7) is implied by the 3rd and 7th of the chord. The ii-V sound is gracefully made when the 7th of the Blmi7 chord (Ab) moves stepwise down to G (the 3rd of the El7). The chromatic countermelody (E)-E-F) in bar 9 creates motion (interest) in the middle voice and is echoed in bar 11.
