

BYE BYE BLACKBIRD

(*Bye Bye Blackbird*, 1962)

Lyric by Mort Dixon Music by Ray Henderson

From a live recording of 1962, this version of "Bye Bye Blackbird" starts with Coltrane's embellishment of the familiar melody. Notice the after-the-beat emphasis in measure 7 (descending D7) and measure 13, as well as the shift from the melody's G# to the altered G (b9) in measure 19. There is a prolonged A note at the downbeat of measure 23 (producing the major 7th of Bm7) and upper and lower diatonic neighbors encircling the F# melody note at the start of measure 24. The quarter-note-triplet phrasing in measure 25 results in an early delivery of the melody note C (i.e., before the downbeat of measure 26).

In the first chorus of the solo, there are anticipations (the three 16th notes before measure 45), prolongations (first half of measure 58), mini progressions (ii-V-I in G from beat 4 of measure 47) and substitutions (A major in measure 57 and E-Lydian in measure 58, both for the Gmaj7 chord change). Notice the suspended triad outlines in measure 58 (B-sus4) and measure 59 (Csus4 and Gsus4).
