3. LEANING ON THE EVERLASTING ARMS - Elisha Hoffman (1839-1929)

In one episode of the show, there is an embarrassing moment when the church organ malfunctions in the middle of a service. It had some keys that would randomly stay down when released (often called a "cipher") and create dissonance. The organist ran out of the sanctuary in tears.

In this arrangement, there is an optional section (between C and D) in honor of an instrumentalist's plight where there is a malfunction. The 2nd euphonium has the cipher in this case.

One idea for a skit might be for the player to be visibly upset by this, and for someone else to bring over a bottle of valve oil and pretend to oil a valve.

7. TWO SONGS FOR OTIS

Little Brown Jug - Joseph Winner

The Vacant Chair - George F. Root

The show's town drunk, Otis, gave the sheriff and his deputy a scare when he bought a car. Due to some misunderstandings, they were afraid Otis was about to drive when drunk so they schemed a way to make him realize the inherent danger of drinking and driving. It may be necessary to educate your audience on the various words used in the show instead of "drunk." The inebriated state was also described as sozzled, tiddly, crooked, gassed, souzed, lit up, or having a snoot full. When Otis was in jail sleeping it off, they woke him and pretended he was not there as they discussed his sad passing. Otis believed he was listening from the Great Beyond. To close off this "lesson" they sang a duet of "The Vacant Chair" and Otis added his voice on the next phrase.

"Little Brown Jug" is used here for an obvious reason and was heard on the show sometimes.

The two songs can be used independently if you wish. There is an optional "connector" ahead of "The Vacant Chair" if you wish to join the two songs as a suite. Another staging option is to have the tuba player begin the woozy introduction offstage, coming onstage and playing in a crooked and drunken manner, timing it to arrive at his/her chair in time for the fermata.

To play the piece without the skit, just begin 2 measures before B.
