Concert Duets is a two-volume collection of 12 Duos for tubas. The first eleven are arrangements of works by prominent 18th Century composers. They are mostly taken from trio sonatas and edited for tubas. The final piece, Tuba Duo Twelve, is an original work in the "Rococo" style. These duets were arranged, over a 15 year period, for many of my tuba playing friends as Christmas gifts. With the urging of many tubists and the T.U.B.A. Press, this edition finally makes them available to everyone. They are fun to play, challenging and good concert pieces.

As a young musician I had the privilege and pleasure of playing duets with many of the world's finest tubists including Harvey Phillips, Bob Pallansch, Dan Perantoni, Chester Schmitz, John Fletcher, Toby Hanks, Ron Bishop, Winston Morris and Tommy Johnson. I learned more about playing music in those sessions than from any other single thing I've ever done. Duets are great teaching tools-a great way to learn rhythm, intonation and musicianship.
