### LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Observe the staccato markings. Staccato is a style marking, and it is a light, separated style. This should be an obvious contrast with the notes that are not marked staccato.

### DYNAMIC MARKINGS

**p** (piano) – soft

**mp** (mezzo piano) – moderately soft

**mf** (mezzo forte) – moderately loud

**f** (forte) – loud

**fp** (forte-piano) – start the note forte, and immediately become piano (soft)

crescendo ( ) – gradually get louder

diminuendo, or decrescendo ( ) – gradually get softer

### STYLE INDICATORS

accent ( > ) – emphasis on a note or chord. Accented notes are separated

staccato ( . ) – detached, separated and light

### OTHER TERMS

slur – an arching line drawn over a group of notes indicating that they should be played legato or connected

tie – a slur connecting two successive notes of equal pitch


