Program Notes

Dragon Fire is a musical work intended to depict the legend of the dragon. Characteristically portrayed as a huge fire breathing, scaly and horned lizard-like creature, with leathery, bat-like wings, four legs and a long muscular tail, they are also known for possessing magical powers or qualities. The typical dragon is said to have protected a cavern or castle filled with gold or treasure and was often associated with a great hero who tried valiantly to slay it.

Be sure to play this piece plenty of energy throughout. Pay close attention to the syncopated rhythms and especially the times when they are different. The articulations (accents, staccatos, etc.) are important to help with the style of the piece. Make sure that the countermelody can be heard in the horns, trombones, and tenor saxophones when it is present (mm. 15-22 and 51-56.) Work toward making sure that mm. 25-38 are balanced and do not drag in tempo. I hope that you have fun playing and enjoy this piece!

About the Composer

Darren Jenkins is a native of Topeka, Kansas. He is a graduate of Washburn University and the University of Kansas, where he studied composition with James Barnes. An award-winning composer, his works have been performed and recorded by various groups across the country, as well as internationally. He has written successfully for virtually every area of instrumental music. In addition to his work as a composer/arranger, Jenkins also enjoys a successful career as a music educator.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Students should focus on dynamic contrasts and playing with appropriate style while maintaining a constant rhythm and tempo. Be careful that you do not slow down when playing softer.

MUSIC THEORY

KEY: Concert E♭ Major. Learn or review the scale and arpeggio, which is printed at the top of each player's part.
