TO THE DIRECTOR

The title alludes to the fact that this chart is a contrafact (new melody written over existing chord changes) on the old standard "Back Home In Indiana", however this chart was commissioned by the Illinois Music Educator's Association. Add to the fact that I live in Michigan and you have several state lines involved! Another famous jazz standard written over these changes was Charlie Parker's "Donna Lee". Have your students listen to the 1917 recording of the Original Dixieland Jazz Band playing "Back Home In Indiana" on what is considered to be the first ever jazz recording (available on YouTube).

Drummers can check out different versions of second line grooves, but the basic one that I notated can be found in a YouTube video by Mark Lantler. For a good example of a more Dixieland style recording, listen to King Oliver's Creole Jazz Band playing "Weather Bird Rag" from 1923.

Experienced bassists and pianists may create their own walking bass line or comping voicings during the solo sections at measures 63, 91, and 145. Notice that these sections should be played in a more modern jazz style, not the New Orleans style from before. The drummer should feel free to include style-appropriate comping patterns on the snare and/or toms during these sections as well. Also have the drummer listen to Philly Joe Jones on the Miles Davis recordings from the late 1950's and early 60's. Pianists could also listen to Red Garland's or Wynton Kelly's comping patterns from these recordings as well.

Ellen Rowe, jazz pianist and composer, is currently Professor and Chair of the Department of Jazz and Contemporary Improvisation at the University of Michigan.
