To The Director

Sergei Prokofiev is probably best known as the composer of "Peter And The Wolf" and the march from "Love for Three Oranges." However, it was his re-creation of 18th century formal structure in the "Classical Symphony, Op. 25" (1916-17) that first brought him to the attention of the musical world. Prokofiev's music is noted for tough, astringent modernism and traditional lyricism.

He was born in Russia in 1911, but moved to Paris as a young man after a brief stay in the United States. Upon his return to Russia in 1933, he found an outlet for his talents in film music. It was during this time that he wrote the music for "Alexander Nevsky" and "Lieutenant Kije" from which this *TROIKA* is drawn. A troika is a sleigh common in Russia, drawn by three horses. It is still in use today as a winter pleasure vehicle. It is capable of traveling at great speeds and creating in its passengers feelings of exhilaration and excitement.

Although he was unhappy with the screenwriters and the production of "Lieutenant Kije", Prokofiev scored at least two versions of the music for the film and published an orchestral suite bearing its title. It is from this original Moscow edition of the suite that this arrangement was adapted. Every effort has been made to remain faithful to the breadth and scope of the composer's intent in making this classic available to younger players.


None of the double stops (triplet and quadruple) are mandatory. In each case, only the top note is important, whether plucked or bowed. The change from arco to pizzicato occurs almost always between a pickup and the downbeat (i.e. mm. 30-31). The musical effect is worth the extra effort. The arranger has carefully placed the anacrusis on an upbow so that the right hand is in position to pluck. Fingerings are all self-evident. The 1st Violin part "lays" easily in first and third positions. All other parts, with very few exceptions, are playable in first position.

The percussion parts can easily be played by extra string players or sightread by borrowed percussionists. Both piano and harp appear in Prokofiev's score, and are also included here as optional parts; if possible, both parts should be employed.

The arranger is indebted to Suzanne Thomas, harpist of the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, for her technical advice on the troubadour harp, and to Vivian Tomb Johnston, NSOA New York State President, for her encouragement in regards to the addition of this instrument in this orchestration.
