Three Cats

Have fun expressing the contrasting personalities of these cats by varying the dynamics and articulation between the three sections. There's an optional solo over the page that follows a 24-bar blues sequence.

The given right-hand notes show how you can play over all four chords using a single 5-note scale – G minor pentatonic. Try improvising your own solo over the same left hand.

In section 'B' the harmonies become more adventurous, and the melody is transferred to the left hand – be sure to bring this out. Before you tackle the whole piece, practice the arpeggios in bars 13–14, 33–40, and the Coda.
