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FOURTEEN CLARINET ETUDES

These etudes are composed of phrases and figures which may be practiced separately and in various keys. They are not only meant to provide exercise for tongue and fingers, but also to present problems in dance style phrasing. The most important point is that they must be played in rhythm "with a swing". If any of the designated phrase marks do not suit the individual player, they may be changed to suit his own taste. Generally, the styleshould be broad and rhythmic. A group of eighth notes are not usually played and or and are involved. The styleshould be played legate and with occasional accents to facilitate keeping the phrases in strict rhythm.

These original etudes were written in various styles and changes of key and tempo to assist the player in developing a smooth melodic style of improvising. Each etude is a complete study in itself.
