NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

This arrangement closely follows the original version of the song and although it is written within the guidelines of the intermediate string orchestra, it maintains the integrity of the original throughout. The melody is featured in short fragments that repeat to help solidify the rhythmic components.

The first four bars of the introduction set up the harmonic structure of the piece until measure 5 and 6 where it builds up to a fortississimo (*fff*). Make sure to check the bow speed and weight used by each player, as well as the distance from the bridge. The idea is to change the bow as much as necessary to get the required volume without forcing the tone. Note that at measure 7, it suddenly drops to a mezzo piano.

This form of the arrangement includes a *Del Segno al Coda*. Before rehearsing the piece, make sure to go over the form, including repeated sections. This will simplify the rehearsal and guarantee a seamless transition throughout the piece.

Overall, keep in mind the value of playing pop tunes with your ensembles. I know that they will quickly identify with what they hear on the radio and probably practice a bit more. *Bones* is a fantastic pop chart for young musicians and don't be surprised when you see the audience dancing in the aisles.
