About the Composer



Steve Wiest is a multiple Grammy-nominated trombonist, composer, author, and cartoonist. The former soloist and writer for Maynard Ferguson, Steve went on to perform on the road with Doc Severinsen and the Old Tonight Show Orchestra as well as many other artists. Steve has numerous recordings out as a leader, the most recent of which is the debut album from the critically-acclaimed all-star horn band Vinyl Hampdin. Along with being the trombonist with the group, Wiest has composed and arranged all eleven tracks for their new recording titled "RED." Joining Steve in Vinyl Hampdin is an all-star assemblage of Grammy and Juno winners: Lisa Dodd, Frank David Greene, Ray Herrmann, Sly5thAve, Stockton Helbing, Ryan Davidson, Eric Gunnison, Art Bouton, and Gerald Stockton.

In the world of jazz education, Steve was formerly the Director of the One O'Clock Lab Band at The University of North Texas and is now Co-Chair of Jazz Studies at The University of Denver's Lamont School of Music where he teaches arranging, composition, jazz trombone and directs the award-winning Lamont Jazz Orchestra. In high demand as a clinician, composer and conductor, Wiest has directed many all-state ensembles and appeared as a guest artist and clinician all over the world.

Exactly What It Is #2 in the Great Quotation Series

The Great Quotation Series is an opportunity for me to write something programmatically inspired by a quote of historical importance. In the case of Exactly What It Is the quote came to me from personal experience. The master trombonist and composer Slide Hampton was a mentor and hero to many people in the jazz community and happily one of my most important teachers and friends. I first met Slide during my years with Maynard Ferguson's band and was instantly captivated by his humble and giving persona. Over the years, I put together event after event to feature the great man so that I could spend time with him, and we all could learn from his mastery. As an aside, I always playfully tried to get him to accept a compliment, but due to his humble nature he would always defer graciously. One time after he won a Grammy, I thought for sure that he would accept my accolades with a simple thank you. Here's what happened:

Me: "Slide, congrats on that Grammy! It must feel wonderful at this point in your career to receive such a validation for all that you've done!"

Slide: "You know Steve, I do feel very excited these days, because now I know Exactly What It Is that I need to practice."

And once again, I learned from Yoda.

Rehearsal Tips

Exactly What It Is is essentially a triplet-based straight-ahead swing ballad that is informed by Slide Hampton's masterpiece *Frame for the Blues*. Just like that chart, it is a slow swinger that builds to a climactic shout chorus. What is different here are the many moods that I set up along the way. Slide used this approach in other pieces that he wrote (his EPIC arrangement of *Shiny Stockings* comes to mind) and in the case of *Exactly What It Is* the solos are spread out between Alto, Trumpet, and Trombone throughout within little vignettes. At the fermata section beginning in M35, the band should approach each whole note as a forte piano to set the stage for the soloist who can then play the written line rubato. Each soloist can feel free to embellish the rubato line in this section or improvise something better!

This slow tempo is quite a challenge for every level of musician. The best way to play it successfully is to be aware of the triplet subdivision of each quarter note pulse. If you think triplet throughout, then you can nail the swing feel and stay perfectly in time. A little too much either side of that pulse and the swing feeling is lost. For the Drums, I prefer the use of the famous Mel Lewis "sacred cymbal" (Zildjian 22" inch Swish Knocker China with rivets) to get that wonderful Thad Jones groove. Such a Cymbal choice works great as a ride behind a Saxophone, to break things up, or at the shout chorus.

Play the roof top articulations fat with separation ala the Vanguard Jazz Orchestra. Enjoy!
