ERIK SATIE

Erik Satie was born in Honfleur, France in 1886 of a musical family - his mother was a pianist and composer, his father a Paris music publisher. In 1883-84, Satie attended the Paris Conservatory with disappointing results as he was not accepting of scholastic training.

He began to compose piano pieces in a very advanced harmonic idiom, and his musical ideas are said to have had a influence on Debussy, whom Satie met in 1890.

Satie lived in obscurity and poverty, only a few friends knew his music. He became a minor celebrity when a group of young composers known as "Les Six" considered him to be a musical pioneer. Satie composed numerous piano-pieces, several ballets and lyric-dramas before his death in Paris in 1925.

RICHARD T. NASH

Richard T. Nash is a native of Boston, Mass.; he attended Tufts University and Berklee College of Music. In his early career days as a trombonist, he played with the bands of Glen Gray, Tex Benecke, Harry James and Benny Goodman.

Upon moving to Los Angeles in 1954, Nash joined the 20th Century Fox movie studio orchestra. In addition to his work as a member of the orchestra, he became active as a orchestrator for the studio.

Nash has written original music for the Stan Kenton orchestra, and has been featured soloist on numerous recordings. He is one of the most sought-after trombone soloists in the Hollywood Motion Picture and Television Studios
