About the Music

While in college, I frequently performed at weddings, banquets, and parties with a string quartet. Joseph Haydn's *Finale to The Bird Quartet* was always a crowd pleaser and an amusing one for us to play. Haydn, known as the Father of the String Quartet, wrote for all sorts of occasions. Coming from a collection known as *The Russian Quartets*, these were written and dedicated to the Grand Duke Paul of Russia in 1781. *The Bird* shows the more playful and lighthearted side of Haydn, portraying birdlike calls as the melody is passed to each section.

To achieve a classical sound, this piece should be approached with light and quick bow strokes mostly at the balance point. 1st violins can be introduced to half-position as there are a few D sharps and A sharps. Your orchestra is sure to enjoy this entertaining arrangement.
