Camille Saint-Saëns (1835-1921) was a French organist and professor at the Paris Conservatoire. A prolific composer, he produced many great works, including operas, symphonies, concerti, chamber and choral works.

Written in 1915 as a musical gift to Boston Symphony trombonist George W. Stewart who helped with the composer's trans-Atlantic voyage to North America as the special guest of the World's Fair in St. Louis. The work has become one of the most popular solos for trombone.


