## **Bert Truax**

Legacies of Honor was commissioned by the Military Academy at West Point for their bicentennial, where it was premiered in 1997. It pays tribute to three colorful figures in the Army's history; heroic bugler Calvin 2 Titus, winner of the Medal of Honor during the China Relief Expedition; Louis Bentz, beloved class bugler of the 1st Artillery Corps, who was buried at West Point after 45 years of faithful service; and illustrious Civil War General Dan Butterfield, composer of *Taps*.

This music is also on the National Parks web site for the World War 2 memorial.

For an additional effect, Trumpet 4, 5 and Field Drum could be performed grouped together as an antiphonal group. If the antiphonal spacing is used, Trumpet 4 should play the opening solo of the ensemble is all together on stage, Trumpet 1 should perform it.



Bert Truax was Second Trumpet with the Dallas Symphony for 23 years. He also played Second Trumpet for the Philadelphia orchestra during their 1935-86 season. As a successful composer, Bert has had commissions from the Dallas Symphony, the Dallas Bach Society, the Military Academy at West Point, and New York Philharmonic Principal Trombonist Joseph Alessi. He continues to freelance and compose in the Dallas metroplex.
